If you know anyone who is moving to the Ft.Lauderdale area, show them this newsletter. This house is FOR SALE.

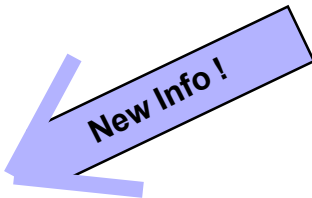

AT WORK IN THE FIELDS OF OUR LORD! We have had a busy summer in Jamaica. Persisence and patience has finally given us a break in the Redtape. As reported earlier, our spring teams worked hard to get the foundation in and the walls erected. Our summer team had the task of leveling the subfloor and then pouring more than 1,200 sq.ft. of concrete.

We had a small team but we were able to offer summer employment to about 8 high school kids from the church. Our team immediately had 8 new friends plus the church hired another 5 skilled laborers. On most days we had 15 workers on the site ready to shovel and carry whatever needed moved.

The work was hard but the fellowship was fantastic. With every water break, snack break, or lunch break came an oppourtuny to talk about family, ours and theirs, and our similarities and differences of lifestyle. The building, all concrete and steel, may last 100 years or more, which seems like a long time, but a friendship built with a fellow Christian brother or sister is something that will last for all eternity.
